

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

Pursuant to the provisions of the Criminal Justice Act, Title 18, U.S.C. § 3600A(a)(1) and (c), and the discretion of the Court, the Office of the Federal Public Defender for the Western District of Tennessee is hereby appointed to represent any defendant who was prosecuted and sentenced in a criminal case in the Western District of Tennessee who was previously determined to have been entitled to appointment of counsel or who is now indigent, to determine whether that defendant may qualify for federal habeas relief in light of *Johnson v. United States*, 135 S. Ct. 2551 (2015), under either 28 U.S.C. § 2255 or 28 U.S.C. § 2241.

The U.S. Probation Office for the Western District of Tennessee and the United States District Court Clerk's Office for the Western District of Tennessee are authorized to disclose Presentence Investigation Reports, Statements of Reasons, and Judgments to the Federal Public Defender's Office for the purpose of assessing eligibility for relief under *Johnson*.
